1. Overall Position

ArticleIInitiative.org concerns Article I of the United States Constitution, which establishes Congress and defines legislative powers.

Its stated mission is to help restore Congress to its proper place in the constitutional order. Its materials address:

- Congressional authority and responsibility
- Separation of powers
- Delegation to executive agencies
- Administrative law and regulation
- Federalism
- Legislative, taxing, spending, and oversight powers
- The relationship among Congress, the executive branch, and the courts

The project provides legal debates, webinars, podcasts, videos, commentary, writing competitions, and educational events.

It does not concern Article the First of the twelve amendments proposed by Congress in 1789. It does not investigate the amendment's ratification history or

advocate for its completion.

3. What Aligns with ATFI

There is some broad conceptual alignment between the Article I Initiative and ATFI:

- Both regard Congress as the constitutional institution intended to represent the people.
- Both encourage constitutional and civic education.
- Both consider the relationship between citizens and Congress.
- Both provide educational materials about constitutional government.
- Both recognize that the constitutional role of Congress deserves greater public attention.

This is general alignment concerning representative government. It is not a shared Article the First campaign.

4. The Central Difference

The organizations study two different constitutional provisions.

Article I is already part of the Constitution. Article the First is a proposed amendment that ATFI considers still pending before the states.

5. Verification Findings

The name uses the Roman numeral "I"

"Article I Initiative" means an initiative concerning Article I of the Constitution. In web addresses, fonts, and search results, a capital I can resemble the number

1 or a lowercase l.

It is a Federalist Society project

The Federalist Society identifies the Article I Initiative as one of its constitutional and legal-education projects. Its stated purpose is to examine and strengthen the institutional role of Congress.

It does not claim to represent Article the First

The organization does not present itself as an Article the First ratification organization. The confusion arises from the appearance and wording of the name—not from a misleading claim made by the project.

Its congressional focus creates limited overlap

Both organizations discuss Congress, representation, and constitutional structure. However, they approach those subjects through different constitutional texts and with different objectives.

It does not address ATFI's historical questions

The website does not investigate:

- The twelve articles proposed in 1789
- State ratification records
- Connecticut's documented action
- The "less" versus "more" wording
- The mathematical paradox
- The eleven documented ratifications
- The continuing status of Article the First
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These omissions should not be treated as

shortcomings because those questions are outside the project's stated purpose.

It can cause search confusion

Search engines and AI-generated search answers may return ArticleInitiative.org when someone searches for Article the First Initiative. The overlapping words and visual similarity between I and 1 make this understandable.

It remains active

The project and its associated Federalist Society pages contain recent legal discussions, events, commentary, videos, and educational materials.

7. Final Neutral Classification

ArticleIInitiative.org is an active Federalist Society legal-education project focused on Article I of the Constitution and the constitutional role of Congress. It is not an Article the First historical-research or ratification organization. It is included in this comparison because its similar name can cause understandable confusion in conventional and AI-assisted searches.

A useful clarification for the ATFI website would be:
Not to be confused with Article I Initiative: Article I Initiative is a Federalist Society project concerning the powers and institutional role of Congress under Article I of the Constitution. Article the First Initiative

concerns the first of the twelve constitutional amendments proposed by Congress in 1789.
